The ADRIARadNet Project

ADRIARadNet is the acronym for ADRIAtic integrated RADar based and web oriented information processing system NETwork.

ADRIARadNet aims at creating an innovative forecasting system for the Adriatic areas to support interregional and international cooperation in the hydrometeorological field. In these areas lowcost radar based infrastructures will be installed and integrated with existing precipitation sensor networks in order to be exploited within the ADRIARadNet project aims .

ADRIARadNet objective is to set up an integrated web-based scalable flexible-interoperable ICT infrastructure, based on a network of lowcost weather radars and satellite data to be integrated with web-oriented geographic information systems, regionally-tuned numerical prediction models and decision support systems for civil prevention and protection within the Central and Southern Adriatic regions.

In summary theADRIARadNet project aims at covering the "last mile" between hydrometeorological community and regional governments which are in charge of civil prevention and protection.

The IPA Adriatic program of cross-border cooperation, which asserts ADRIARadNet project, includes the regions of Europe bor- dering the Adriatic Sea: Albania, Bosnia Erzegovina, Croatia, Greece, Italy, Montenegro, Serbia e Slovenia. The project brings together institutions and organizations from three countries (Italy, Croatia and Albania) reaching a total of eight partner. Leading partner is the Center of Excellence CETEMPS of University of L'Aquila. The other beneficiaries are the Italian Direzione LL.PP e Protezione Civile (Civil Protection) - Centro Funzionale of the Abruzzo Region, la Protezione Civile - Centro Funzionale of the Marche region and Beep Innovation Company. There are three Albanian partners: the Ministry of the Interior-Civil emergency, the Institute of Geosciences IGEWE and the Albanian branch of the Foundation CIMA of Savona. Croatia is represented by the Dubrovnik Region, Neretva.
